

Curriculum		Last year, GFM achieved excellent results across all phases, strengthened its curriculum through the new 2025–2028 strategy, deepened its focus on reading and teaching quality, and prepared for the next step in digital learning and assessment.		This year, our priority is to strengthen early Arabic bilingual learning, align the curriculum from FS2 to Year 9, integrate future-ready skills like digital literacy and AI, and enhance teaching through regular assessment, staff training, and responsive planning to ensure every child makes strong progress.		We are moving toward full KHDA compliance. The Arabic team has strengthened the FS2 and Year 1 curriculum, introduced Arabee for students and teachers, and begun a Year 1 Arabic A baseline reading assessment to share with KHDA. Across Primary and Secondary, curriculum audits have improved sequencing and progression, with English, Maths, and Science refined and Secondary overviews updated for next year. Digital skills are embedded, with e safety, computing, and an introductory AI course in Secondary, and many students are taking part in national and international competitions. Regular assessments, moderation, and teacher coaching through TLAG are in place, and staff are using Century data to plan support and drive progress.

Since September, GFM has seen a clear improvement in behaviour and school culture through the Be a GEM approach. Students have been awarded over 200,000 achievement points so far, showing a strong focus on effort, kindness, and respect. Teachers and leaders now track behaviour and rewards weekly, helping to celebrate success and address concerns quickly. New routines, visible leadership, and the GEMS Gateway have created a calmer and more positive start to each day, while the updated behaviour policy ensures consistency across all phases.
